

## **DARTFORD**


Located on the border of Kent, London and Essex, Dartford is one of the most exciting and dynamic towns in the county.

Shopaholics will find plenty to occupy themselves with in Dartford which lies within easy reach of Bluewater Shopping Centre, home to major brands and a fantastic food and drink offer. In Dartford itself you can find many local gems, including regular markets on Thursdays and Saturdays and Farmers Markets on the third Friday of every month.

The Orchard Theatre, located in the town centre, is a cultural hub providing audiences with a large range of drama, dance, music and entertainment. The Mick Jagger Centre on Shepherd's Lane is also an excellent facility for community arts. Art and history lovers will enjoy a trip to Dartford Library, which is also home to Dartford Borough Museum and the Sir Peter Blake Gallery, an exhibition space for emerging and established artists.

Dartford town lies at the point where the River Darent joins the Thames. From here you can follow the Darent Valley Path south to the river's source in the Greensand Hills, offering excellent walking opportunities and beautiful views. There are plentiful green spaces around the town, including Central Park, a lovely formal park in the town centre with a children's play area and flower gardens. Darenth Country Park and Beacon Wood Country Park offer an escape to nature and beautiful woodland walks.

# **WALKING ROUTES**

#### DARENT VALLEY PATH

This 19-mile waymarked path is one of Kent's greatest hidden treasures, with fine walking opportunities for all the family. It meanders from the banks of the busy River Thames at Dartford through the Kent Downs Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty, to the Greensand Hills above Sevenoaks. Walks range from gentle strolls between historic inns, to bracing climbs to the top of the Downs with panoramic views across the valley. Not all these paths are wheelchair/pushchair accessible and discretion is advised.

## **BEACON WOOD WALK**

A gently rolling 1.25-mile walk, with a shorter option of 0.6 miles. The paths are well-compacted with occasional stones, making it ideal for young families to explore. Enjoy a stroll through scenic woodland with fantastic views of the wildlife pond and across the surrounding countryside

## **CYCLE ROUTES**



#### NATIONAL CYCLE ROUTE 1

Route 1 is an adventurous National Cycle Route connecting Dover in South Kent to the Shetland Islands northeast of Scotland. From Dartford you can follow the route east through Gravesend, where you can either continue onwards to the historic cathedral city of Canterbury and the coastal towns of Deal and Dover, or you can pick up Route 177 and visit Cyclopark, a fantastic cycling facility. Alternatively, follow Route 1 west from Dartford to head into London.

### **NATIONAL CYCLE ROUTE 125**

Route 125 is a 3.6-mile route connecting Brooklands Lake to the bank of the River Thames via Dartford town centre and Central Park. This attractive path is traffic-free and wellsurfaced making it ideal for walkers and cyclists of all abilities.

# **GETTING AROUND**

Dartford is less than an hour by train from multiple London mainline stations and only 15 minutes from Gravesend, where you can hop on a high-speed train to London St Pancras or Ashford International. Dartford is also well-connected to the Medway towns.

Frequent local services to nearby towns and Bluewater are run by Arriva Bus Services and Fastrack buses provide fast and frequent services at 10-minute intervals between Dartford Town Centre, Bluewater, Darent Valley Hospital, Ebbsfleet Station and Gravesend Town Centre.

Ask at the Crossing Offices for a pick-up vehicle to transport you and your cycle across the Dartford Crossing. This service is free. You cannot cycle over the bridge or through the tunnel.

With two National Cycle Routes passing through the centre of Dartford, there is no better way to travel around the town. There are walking and cycling waymarkers around the town centre to help you find your way around. Take a look at the map to see how far you could cycle in only 15 minutes.

Walking and cycling aren't just rewarding and fun ways to get around; leaving the car at home for some trips will save you money and reduce emissions. It also allows you to be active as part of your daily routine, helping you to stay fit and healthy.



# THINGS TO DO

The Manor Gatehouse sits on a site chosen by Henry VIII and was once the home of Anne of Cleves. This historic building is now a popular wedding venue and visitors can enjoy the lovely gardens.

Dartford Borough Museum has been collecting fascinating objects relating to the history of Dartford for over 100 years.

The Bridge Sculpture Trail is a collection of sculptures made from reclaimed and recycled materials which can be found around the Bridge development.
