





Grove Ferry Canoe Trail

Take to the water and explore this stunning stretch of the Great Stour River, where you will be surrounded by lush greenery and wildlife. Keep quiet and you might see a water vole scurrying along the riverbank, or a heron half-hidden in the reeds.

-  **Canoe Trail** – Fordwich to Grove Ferry Picnic Site (5 miles/2.5 hours)
-  **Canoe Trail Extension** – Grove Ferry Picnic Site to Plucks Gutter (3.3 miles/2 hours)
-  **River Walk** – Grove Ferry to Fordwich (5 miles/2.5 hours)
-  **River Walk Extension** – Grove Ferry Picnic Site to Plucks Gutter (3.5 miles/1.5 hours)

-  Refreshments
-  Parking
-  Toilets
-  Canoe hire
-  Canoe launch



Bring your own canoe or hire one from Canoe Wild at either Fordwich or Grove Ferry. Pay and display parking is available at Grove Ferry Picnic Site, from here you can make use of the new launch and follow the trail in any direction.

You can also start your paddle in Fordwich and follow the winding trail downriver to Grove Ferry, with an optional extension to Plucks Gutter for the experienced canoeist. To get to Fordwich arrange a lift with Canoe Wild (free to canoe hire customers).

A scenic walk through Stodmarsh National Nature Reserve offers more opportunities to spot wildlife. Look out for marsh harriers soaring overhead!

River Safety Tips:

Know Your Limits

Ensure that you have the correct levels of experience and knowledge for this self-guided river trail. Keep right to avoid oncoming craft. Do not go in the lake.

Be Prepared

Equip yourself responsibly with boat, paddle, bailer/sponge, buoyancy aid, first aid kit, pen knife, mobile phone, drinking water, waterproof jacket and weather appropriate gear. Check the weather forecast and tides and currents before your journey.

Do Not Disturb Wildlife

Never approach wildlife head on, or so close that you disturb its natural behaviour. Stay quiet while keeping your distance.

Respect River Users

The river is a shared space with other users, such as fisherman, so please be respectful and considerate of each other.

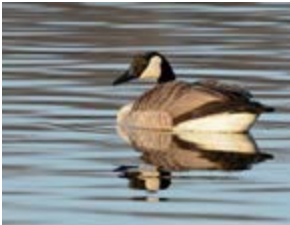
