

SITTINGBOURNE AND **FAVERSHAM**

The industrial town of Sittingbourne in north Kent offers a lively town centre, excellent food offer, and plenty of access to the surrounding countryside. Nearby, the historic town of Faversham offers up another side of Kent, steeped in heritage and tradition.

In Sittingbourne, you will find plenty to entertain you with the theatre, cinema, go karting and much more. The town centre features small independent shops amongst the high street retailers as well as some charming cafes to stop at for refreshments. You can learn more about the history of the town by visiting Sittingbourne Heritage Hub and the Old Forge War

Sittingbourne is surrounded by peaceful villages set in beautiful orchards and farmlands, perfect for a day out to escape the hustle and bustle of the town. Milton Creek Country Park is the perfect spot to enjoy a picnic and look out for our local wildlife.

Follow National Cycle Route 1 to the east, through idyllic countryside to reach Faversham, the oldest market town in Kent. Here you will discover an amazing variety of independent shops, a regular street market (Tuesdays, Fridays and Saturdays) and fine local food and drink.

Brogdale Collections, home to over 4000 varieties of fruit trees, is well worth a visit. Take a guided tour of the orchard, sample the many flavours, and take part in regular events and festivals. Finally, unwind with a visit to Oare Marshes Nature Reserve and take in the views across the Swale to the Isle of Sheppey.

SYNDALE VALLEY WALK

This 11-mile trail, with an optional shortcut, takes you through peaceful villages, wildlife havens and an Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty. Escape to a land that time forgot, where farming, food and rural traditions remain the cornerstones of community life among the unspoilt and picturesque scenery of the Syndale Valley.

FAVERSHAM TWO CREEKS WALK

Discover all that Faversham has to offer on this 4.6-mile walk, taking in the historic sights of the town, the busy boatyards along the creek and the views across the marshes. This walk also takes you past Shepherd Neame, Britain's oldest brewer, where you can book a tour of the brewery.



OARE MARSHES WETLANDS AND WILDLIFE

Starting in the quaint village of Oare, with its history of boatbuilding and fishing, follow the creek on this 5-mile walk around Oare Marshes Nature Reserve. This 200-acre site is an internationally important wetland due to the huge number of migratory and breeding wetland birds you can find here.

NATIONAL CYCLE ROUTE 1

National Cycle Route 1 stretches all the way from the White Cliffs of Dover to the north of Scotland. The route takes in everything, from medieval towns and cathedrals to quaint villages and rolling countryside. It is an ideal escape into nature for many Kent towns. Follow it east from Sittingbourne, through Faversham and the Cathedral City of Canterbury to Dover and fantastic views from the clifftops across to France. Or go west through the Medway towns to Gravesend and London. Route 1 is also part of the Euro Velo, a network of long-distance cycle routes which connect the whole European continent.

THINGS TO DO

Sittingbourne and Kemsley Light Railway

Take a fascinating journey on this heritage steam railway across a mile-long viaduct, through the marshes of a country park to Kemsley Down where a working paper mill still exists.

Oare Gunpowder Works Country Park

This hidden gem close to Faversham town centre is a unique blend of history and wildlife. Surfaced trails lead you through scenic woodland and the abandoned ruins of the old gunpowder mills.

Shepherd Neame Visitor Centre

Take a look behind the scenes of Britain's oldest brewery with a guided tour and experience a taste of their specialty lagers and ales.

GETTING AROUND

Swale has excellent rail connections to London Victoria and high speed trains from St Pancras to Faversham and Sittingbourne, where you can connect with the Swale branch line service to Sheerness on Sea. The Swale Line provides easy access to attractions including the Sittingbourne and Kemsley Light Railway, Milton Creek Country Park and the historic harbour town of Queenborough. Cycles can be taken on any offpeak Southeastern service.

National Cycle Route 1 links Faversham, Sittingbourne and Kemsley, where you can join Route 174 and follow it across the bridge to the Isle of Sheppey. Each town centre has plenty of cycle parking available. Take a close look at the map and see how easy it is to walk or cycle from your home to the station, school, or town centre.

Walking and cycle aren't just fun ways to get around leaving the car at home on some trips will save you money and reduce emissions. It also allows you to be active as part of your daily routine, helping you to stay fit and healthy.
